#### Google Classroom

Many of you will have heard that we are starting to use Google Classroom across the school. This will help us to provide remote learning to the children in the event of a second lockdown, but also is a great way of organising home learning. Some parents and carers may not have seen Google Classroom before so we have some handy hints for you below.

#### What is Google Classroom?

Google Classroom is a class-organization platform that incorporates Google's core G Suite (Google Docs, Sheets, Slides, Drive, and other Google products) so pupils can access everything they need for a class, including homework assignments, group projects and files.

#### How do you set up Google Classroom?

Your child will get an email invite from their teacher with a link or a code they use to join a class. They'll be directed to **classroom.google.com**, where they log in using their school-created account to access the class their teacher has added them to. Each class is private to the people the teacher has personally invited, including the pupils enrolled in that class and other teachers. If you are having trouble logging in, please speak to your class teacher.

Can I communicate with my child's teacher through Google Classroom?

It's possible, though we have disabled this feature for the time being. If you need to communicate with your child's class teacher please use the class email or phone the school as usual.

#### Can Google Classroom be used for cheating or chatting?

There's nothing to prevent pupils from opening up other tabs, such as Wikipedia or Google Search, while they're using Google Classroom. Children can potentially see other pupils' work within the platform, too. If they're taking a quiz in Google Forms, however, teachers can disable access to other resources using a feature called Quiz Lock. In some cases, we will encourage children to collaborate on ideas or check each other's work – this is just good learning!

Children can interact with other people in their Google Class – but the teachers can see everything that is written and it will be monitored regularly. If anyone is abusing this privilege, we may elect to 'mute' them for a set amount of time.

#### When do we start?

Year 6 will be trialling their homework on Google Classroom this week with the rest of the school to follow imminently. We are practising logging in at school before rolling it out for home learning.
