My Dyslexia Story By Mr Carter

As a child I struggled with writing and I often found reading a struggle. As a child I was unsure why this was. Why couldn't I remember things like other children in my class? No matter how many times I was told, their and there would be the wrong way round or spellings jumbled on my page. But this never stopped me.

As school work started to become more demanding I developed strategies to help mask the "issues" I was struggling with. It wasn't until I started to train as a teacher that someone sat me down and spoke to me about dyslexia. And this is where my dyslexia story began at the age of 19. As someone who is dyslexic, I feel it is important to share my story with others. One quote I feel defines my attitude towards dyslexia is as follows:

"Dyslexia is not a pigeonhole to say you can't do anything. It is an opportunity and a possibility to learn differently. You have magical brains, they just process differently. Don't feel like you should be held back by it."

This week Nursery have been learning about feelings and emotions such as happy, sad, angry and proud. We also had our first 'show and tell' where all the children were invited to bring their favourite toys from home, talk about them and share them with their friends.





Dyslexia is a learning difficulty which primarily affects reading and writing skills. However, it does not only affect these skills. Dyslexia is actually about information processing. Dyslexic people may have difficulty processing and remembering information they see and hear, which can affect learning and the acquisition of literacy skills.

Dyslexia can also impact on other areas such as organisational skills. It is important to remember that there are positives to thinking differently. Many dyslexic people show strengths in areas such as reasoning and in visual and creative fields.
