It is not just in America, but all around the world that these appalling acts happen. In Australia, protesters relived the death of David Dungay, a 26-year-old Indigenous Australian man who died whilst being restrained by five guards in 2015. He also cried the haunting phrase, "I can't breathe." Meanwhile, just this week, a police commissioner in Sydney said that an officer filmed casually attacking an Indigenous teenager with brutal violence had "had a bad day."






Mohamed made mini pizzas!




