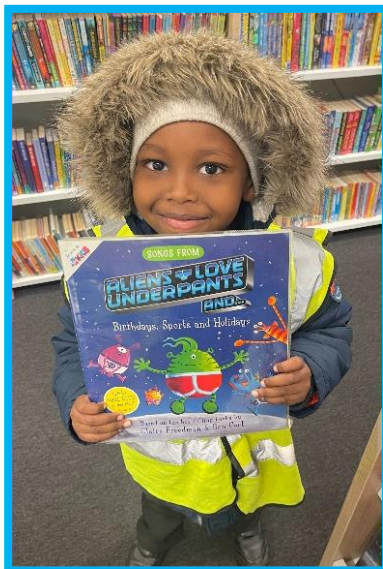
They said "Kelly Hydraulics do lots of work in the local area so it's great to give back something to the local community. Good luck at the London Youth Games Flora girls!"
