No child under the age of puberty is obliged or should be expected to fast. The Imams, Islamic scholars, experts, chaplains and leaders we consulted felt, however, that many young children may want to do a partial fast, which is best done under parental supervision after school hours and at weekends. If primary children are fasting during school hours, teachers and staff do need to know so that they can safeguard against any risk to health. Please write a letter to Mr Naismith if your child will be fasting during Ramadam.

If any members of staff notice signs of dehydration or exhaustion in any pupils who are fasting, then the pupil will be advised to terminate the fast immediately by drinking some water. They will be reassured that in this situation, Islamic rulings allow them to break their fast and make it up later.

During Ramadan, the school will dedicate some assemblies to the Muslim faith and the festival of Eid-ul-Fitr, in order to create a more thorough understanding of the religion and fasting throughout the school.
